

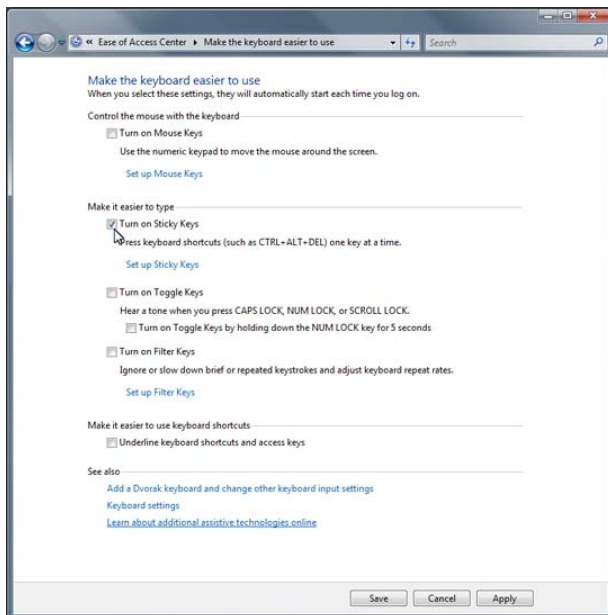

## Setting “Sticky Keys” in Vista

**Sticky Keys** enables the user to use keyboard combinations while only holding down one key at a time. Instead of having to press three keys at once (such as when you must press the CTRL, ALT, and DELETE keys together to log on to Windows), you can press one key at a time by turning on Sticky Keys. Then, you can press a modifier key (such as CTRL, ALT, the Windows Key, or Shift) and have it remain active until another key is pressed.

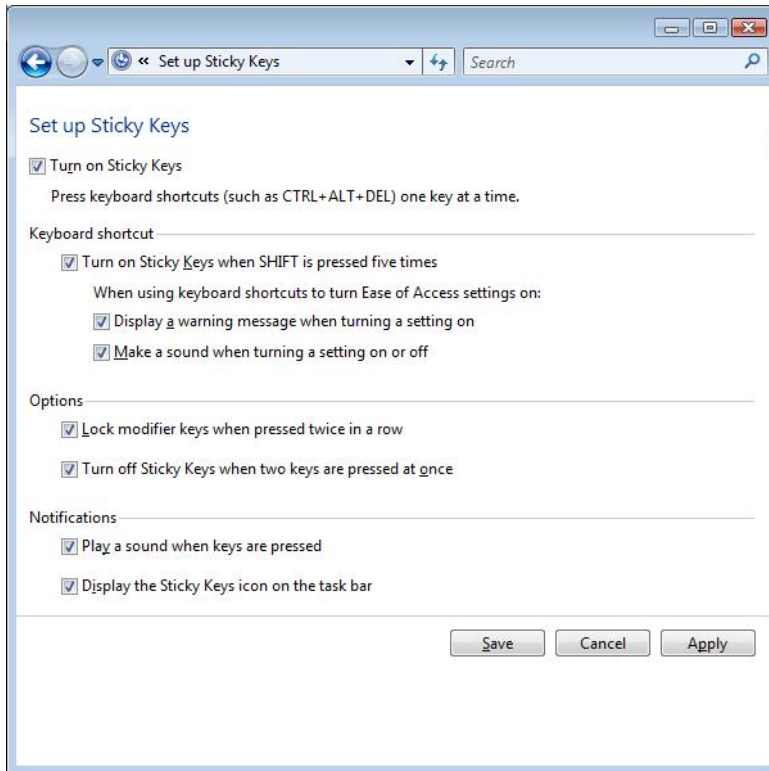

<p>Under When using keyboard shortcuts to turn Ease of Access settings on select from these options:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Display a warning message when turning a setting on.</li> <li>• Make a sound when turning a setting on or off.</li> </ul>	<p>Under When using keyboard shortcuts to turn Ease of Access settings on choose from these options:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Display a warning message when turning a setting on by pressing ALT+A.</li> <li>• Make a sound when turning a setting on or off by pressing ALT+M.</li> </ul>
<p>Under Options and Notifications you can choose to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lock modifier keys when pressed twice in a row.</li> <li>• Turn off Sticky Keys when two keys are pressed at once.</li> <li>• Play a sound when keys are pressed.</li> </ul> <p>Display the Sticky Keys icon on the task bar.</p>	<p>Under Options and Notifications you can choose to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lock modifier keys when pressed twice in a row by pressing ALT+L.</li> <li>• Turn off Sticky Keys when two keys are pressed at once by pressing ALT+O.</li> <li>• Play a sound when keys are pressed by pressing ALT+Y.</li> <li>• Display the Sticky Keys icon on the task bar by pressing ALT+I.</li> </ul>
<p>Select Save.</p>	<p>Select Save by pressing ALT+S.</p>
