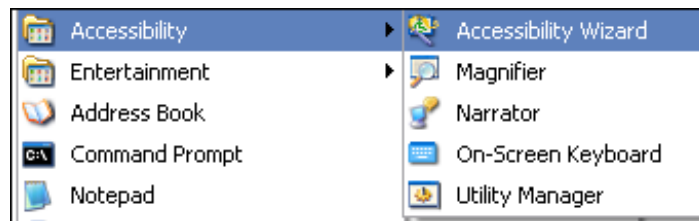
Using the Utility Manger for Accessibility Features Windows XP

Utility Manager

The Utility Manager is an accessibility utility that enables users to check the status of accessibility features like Magnifier, Narrator, and the On-Screen Keyboard. You may also start or stop these features and control the settings of these features.

To use the mouse to navigate to the Utility Manager:

Start > Programs > Accessibility > Utility Manager



Note that this route will also provide access to features such as:

- the Accessibility Wizard
- Magnifier
- Narrator
- the On-Screen Keyboard.

To use a keyboard shortcut to go directly to the Utility Manager:

Press the Windows Logo key plus U

The Utility Manager dialog box will open.



Here you will find the status of the accessibility features.

You may Start or Stop a highlighted feature.

You may control when the features load.

Magnifier

If you activate the Magnifier feature, you will have new settings boxes that will appear.

Click on the Do not show box to disable the information box.



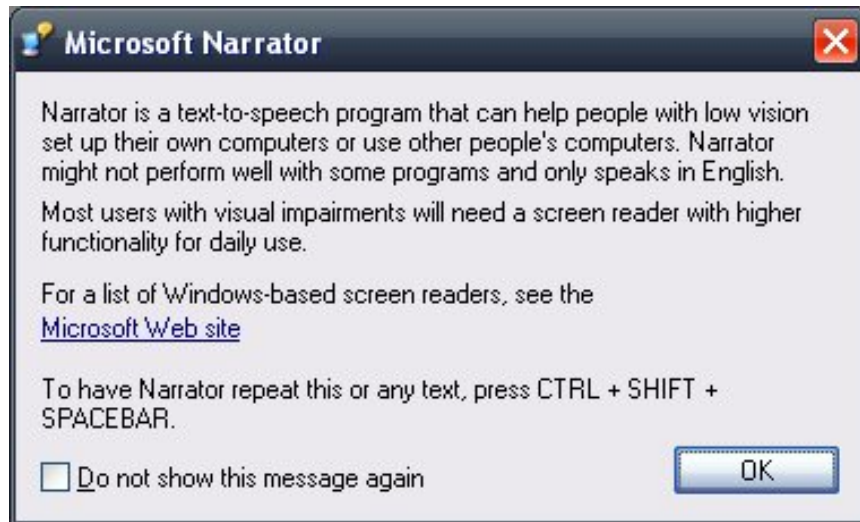
You may control the settings for Magnifier in the options dialog box.



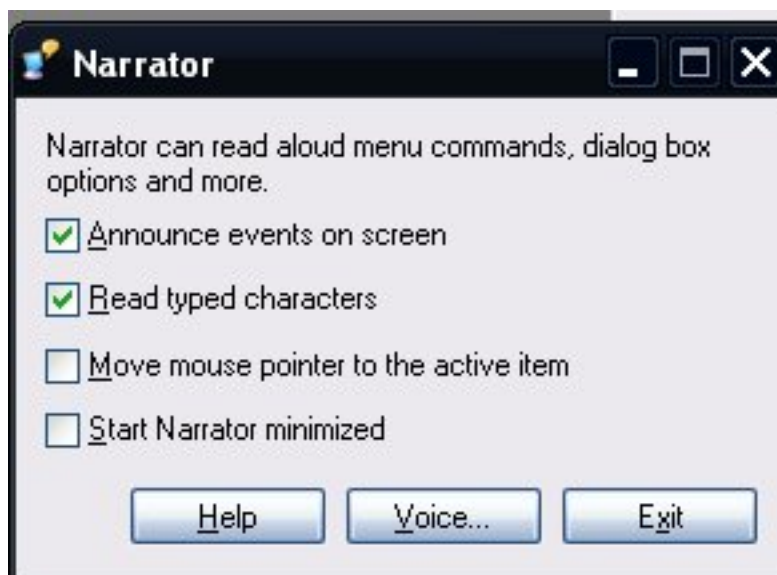
Narrator

If you activate Narrator, you will have new settings boxes that will appear.

Click on the Do not show box to disable the information box.

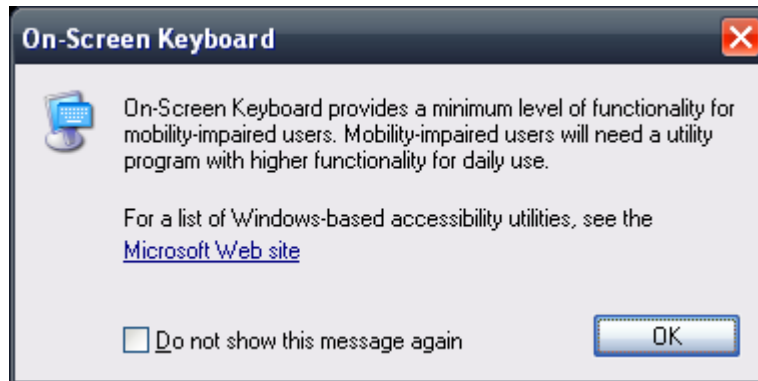


You may control the settings for Narrator in the options dialog box.



On-Screen Keyboard

If you activate the On-Screen Keyboard feature, you will see the following dialog box, click on the Do not show box to disable.



You may control the settings for the on-screen keyboard via the Menu Bar on the keyboard.
